170 mid-Michigan soup kitchens, shelters and hunger-relief organizations. This year alone, **HIDDEN HARVEST** will distribute more than **2.3 million pounds** of healthy surplus food, There is no charge to the agencies. Since 1994, **HIDDEN HARVEST** has distributed more than **19.2 million pounds** of food products to agencies that help feed our neighbors in need.

# HIDDEN HARVEST helps deliver for the Postal Food Drive



It's the 20th anniversary of the National Association of Letter Carriers, Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive. For two decades now, this annual national drive has proved critical in helping millions of American families who are struggling to make ends meet.

Sixteen percent of all Americans are at risk of hunger—uncertain where their next meal may be coming from. That includes 1 in 5 children under the age of 18, plus 4 million seniors who are forced every day to choose between paying a utility bill and buying food.

Each year, the second Saturday in May is a day when all citizens have an opportunity, with the help of their letter carrier, to easily donate food to needy families in their community.

HIDDEN HARVEST participates in Bay and Saginaw postal food drives by providing trucks for pick ups for the past 12 years. We then deliver the food items to the various



food pantries, shelters and soup kitchens in Bay and Saginaw Counties. Food that is collected in our area stays right here and is delivered free of charge. Agencies are thrilled with this yearly food drive.

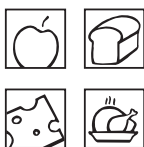

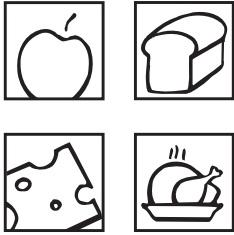

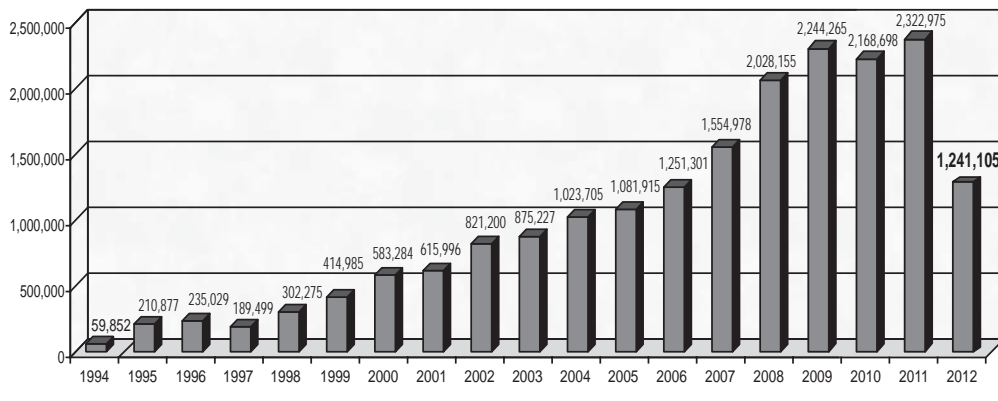
